CLASS OF 2022 RECEIVE TRAINING



Treat yourself, and *invite a friend* to join you at *The Joy of Gardening*, this year's Oregon Master Gardener Association Mini-College and annual gathering of all of the state's Master Gardeners and friends.

There are 20 different classes for you to choose from. Go deep with plant experts exploring and growing native plants, roses, fig trees, berries, peppers, olive and apple trees, irises, tomatoes, and turf. Discover resources for Mason bees and Oregon Flora. Learn current science techniques for soil fertility, raised beds, permaculture, dry gardening, seed starting, hydroponics and smart strategies for *less work* (a favorite topic)!

Get inspired with two excellent *keynote talks.* Friday morning, Dr. Samantha Chisholm Hatfield will speak about Traditional Ecological Knowledge (TEK), climate change impacts, Indigenous ecosystems and food systems.

On Saturday we'll hear from Dr. Gail Langellotto about Successes, Challenges and Opportunities in the Oregon Master Gardener Program.

Optional tours include area nurseries, Oak Creek Center for Urban Horticulture at OSU, a brewery tour and the Corvallis Saturday Market. Other options include low-cost lodging in the dorms and a Thursday night minor league baseball game and social get together.

Please note: Our annual conference is priced to just cover costs incurred and we try hard to keep the cost low so all Master Gardeners can attend. Meals on your own can be purchased near by.




Statewide Awards
