### Easy to earn continuing education hours - and so much fun!

The annual Joy of Gardening conference this summer was enthusiastically received by MG's and guests.

A long line queued up to ask questions after Andony Melathopoulos, OSU Extension Service pollinator specialist, talked about searching for the more than 700 wild bees species of Oregon and he shared stories of volunteers hunting for these oftenrare bees, some unseen for decades.

The OSU Extension Master Melittologist program trains community scientists to populate the Oregon Bee Atlas - the largest database on native bees and the plants they're associated with - in the world.

James Cassidy, a senior instructor and soil scientist in the College of Agricultural Sciences, spoke enthusiastically about soil, which he told people, is the basis of life.

"Soil is the most diverse habitat on the planet. A single pinch of soil contains over a billion living organisms. Those organisms are cycling carbon, energy, water and nutrients and making them available to your garden plants; the veggies just come along for the ride. Bottom line: Soil is a complex habitat, a living thing. To maintain and improve soil, minimize disturbance and add organic matter!"

Some of the other 25 topics covered: raised bed gardening, growing shiitake mushrooms, pesticides and pest management, fire-resistant landscaping, the successful Food Hero program, and the contributions of community scientists to the Oregon Season Tracker program.

**All applicants** for a scholarship to attend this year received the funds - so start planning for next year!

#### **ADVOCACY TASK FORCE A SUCCESS**

RECAP - August 2022: Concern for unfilled vacancies in Benton/Linn, Clatsop, Tillamook, and Douglas counties prompted the formation of the OMGA Advocacy Task Force. Feb-May 2020: Task Force members engaged chapter leadership and membership in advocacy. Our advocacy led to all counties receiving temporary measures ranging from limited time positions to augmented Extension staff positions to support MG training and other activities. Filling MG positions became among Extension Director Dr. Lyles' top priorities.

Outcome: OSU Statewide Public Service Programs were funded by the OregonLegislature **above** the Continuing Service Level for 2023-2025. Four MG Program positions will be filled with hiring processes underway, with Master Gardeners involved in the hiring process.

MGs proved we can be a strong, formidable force in advocacy. Well Done!



### POLLINATOR LICENSE PLATE

The art for a new Oregon license plate was created by 16-year-old Marek Stanton, the youngest member of the OSU Master Melittologist program. Data collected by the volunteers fill the Oregon Bee Atlas, an ongoing list of Oregon's 700+ native bees, with the goal of improving pollinator health.
