## **OSU Extension Program Coordinator Report – Brook Edmunds**

Thank you to all volunteers, chapters and OMGA for a great summer of volunteering! So many great outreach projects and a wonderful OMGA conference. Thank you for sharing your time with the Master Gardener Program.

Applications are beginning to open for 2024 Master Gardener annual trainings. Please help amplify the recruitment messages being sent out by your county coordinators on social media and share with friends, family, and other community groups. Also, please plan to help engage our new students by serving as a mentor, volunteering at the training, participating with social events and being a welcoming face to folks who are joining our organizations.

Don't forget to report your volunteer and continuing education hours into your county's reporting system. (And encourage and help other volunteers to report, too!) These are important to show administrators and funders how involved we are. Last year over 108,000 hours and 78,000 contacts were reported for the state

Thank you to the counties who sent volunteers to the Oregon State Fair in Salem! Participating this year were 120 volunteers from Marion, Polk, Linn, Benton, Columbia, Clackamas, Washington, Multnomah, and Yamhill counties. Our activity booth reached over 5,800 people.

Updates on Master Gardener Program open positions as of 9/8:

- The Statewide Master Gardener Program Manager position closes on Sept 12. (This deadline may be extended if there are not enough applicants.)
- The Portland Metro Professor of Practice position: Interviews are complete and an offer will be made next week.
- Linn-Benton County Outreach Program Coordinator is interviewing three candidates on 9/18. (Information will be sent out soon on how to participate.)
- A search committee has been formed for the Tillamook and Clatsop County Outreach Program Coordinator searches. No timeline at this point.
- The Douglas County Outreach Program Coordinator position is still on hold as of 9/15.
- The Curry County Education Program Assistant position is vacant. The office manager and Coos County MG Program staff will be temporarily managing that program.

# Advocacy Committee Report – Sherry Sheng OMGA Advocacy Task Force

## OMGA Advocacy Task Force Third Quarter, 2023

This report summarizes the work of the Advocacy Task Force during the past 12 months (August 2022 – August 2023)

## The Problem – 4 Vacant MG Program Positions in 5 Counties

 August 2022 -- Concern for unfilled vacancies in Benton/Linn, Clatsop, Tillamook, and Douglas counties prompted the formation of the OMGA Advocacy Task Force

#### What We Did

- August/September 2022 We met with **Dr. Lyles** and he **promised to add 3 MG Program positions** IF Extension gets a good level of State of Oregon funding, OMGA mobilized to provide advocacy during the 2023 legislative session.
- October/November/December 2022 We got organized and **got trained** from OSU Government Relations and OSU Extension Administration
- December/January 2023 We developed **advocacy tools** and shared them with OMGA members through several means including content on the **OMGA Website** <a href="https://omga.org/advocacy/">https://omga.org/advocacy/</a>
- February May 2023 **Task Force members engaged chapter leadership and membership in advocacy.**

#### What We Gained

- Our advocacy led to **Benton/Linn**, **Clatsop**, **Tillamook**, **and Douglas** counties **receiving temporary measures** ranging from limited time positions to augmented Extension staff positions to support MG training and other activities.
- Filling MG positions became among Dr. Lyles' top priorities. See his comments from May 2023, referenced in the second quarterly report.
- OSU Statewide Public Service Programs were funded by the Oregon Legislature **above the Continuing Service Level** for 2023-2025.
- Four MG Program positions will be filled with hiring processes underway, per Dr. Sam Angima's email of June 2023.
- Sherry Sheng emailed a request for **MG representatives' involvement in the hiring** process for these positions. Dr. Sam Angima and Dr. Brooke Edmunds both agreed.

• MGs proved we can be a strong, formidable force in advocacy. See comments from Senator Sarah Gelser in 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter report.
